Bustling and busy like all Chinese cities, Xi'an proves easier than most to navigate. At the centre is the famous Bell Tower, and contained within the city are many other interesting sights to see, the Muslim Quarter, with its ancient mosque, the Temple of the Eight Immortals, the Tang Paradise Gardens, the Wild Goose Pagoda, and many others.

Days off are never dull – there's always something to see and do, and for the more adventurous there are overnight trips to nearby towns and villages to see rural and little-travelled China, as well as nearby famous mountains.

Cost of Living

Unlike bigger cities on the East coast of China, Xi'an is still a very affordable city to live in. A lower cost of living means that a student's salary goes further every month, leaving them free to save, spend on travel, or send money back home. As a rough guide:
